TOP BOWLERS WE HAVE KNOWN

Karen Murphy inducted into the Sport Australia Hall of Fame.



Congratulations to Karen Murphy, the first woman bowler and only the third lawn bowler to receive that honour.

Club members will remember Karen Murphy's visit to Mount Waverley as one of Steve Glasson guest players in the Glasson Invitation tournament.

Karen Murphy represented her country for 23 years before retiring from international competition in 2019 "at the ripe old age of 45". She won gold at the World Outdoor Bowls Championships in singles, pairs and fours. She won gold in the singles at the World Indoor Bowls Championships. And she won gold in the pairs at the 2006 Commonwealth Games.

She still plays at club level, and is the assistant coach of the national team, the Jackaroos.

TOP TIPS FROM THE TOP PLAYER

Karen has some important advice:

How you manage your time is important.

As a sport with a lot of downtime – exchanging ends, watching your opponent's delivery – there is **also a danger of OVERTHINKING**, to fixate on the bad bowl, or otherwise become neurotically entangled!

... so developing the ability to switch concentration on and off like a light switch – to better conserve your energy – is crucial.

IMPORTANT PLAYING PROTOCOLS

A reminder of some of the basic rules and protocols which need to be observed. More to follow in the subsequent editions.

Possession of the rink

See Section 1.3, Laws of the Game, Crystal. Fourth Edition.

If you are at the "mat end" of the rink and your opponent is about to deliver a bowl - you MUST stand at least 1 metre BEHIND the mat.

You **MUST NOT** step onto the mat until your opponent's bowl has come to rest and he/she has moved aside.

If you are at the "head end" of the rink and your opponent is about to deliver a bowl, you MUST stand BEHIND the jack and CLEAR of the head. This means BEHIND rearmost bowl in the head. If there is a toucher in the ditch, this means standing on the bank.

Common sense should prevail, e.g. There is no need to stand on the bank if the toucher is in the ditch at what is essentially a short end. However, at all times the team in possession of the rink has a right to a clear view of all bowls in the head.

Occupation of adjoining rinks.

All players who have completed a game on adjoining rinks must leave the green and MUST NOT stand and observe play on rinks still in play.

Basic courtesy.

Measuring shots. All players not involved in the actual measurement of shots should stand clear of the head until the measuring is completed.

Measuring shots by an umpire.

All players should stand well clear of the head to allow the umpire clear and unobstructed access to the head.

The umpire's decision MUST be respected at all times.

Shirley is a lover of sport, having played many sports in her life, but her main sport was Netball. Shirley's philosophy is to give her best effort at all times when playing any sport.


Shirley said, "Being a new member of COM is certainly one way of getting to know a wide range of people in the club and the extensive range of activities which take place."


